

## CENTER MONTESSORI SCHOOL

### HOW DO YOU INSPIRE, EDUCATE AND ENGAGE CHILDREN EVERYDAY?

One of the primary ways that we inspire our students is through individualized attention. The Montessori method addresses the individual child wherever that child is developmentally, emotionally, academically, and physically. Unlike traditional teaching methods where children are taught the same curriculum at the same time. the benefit of the Montessori method is that each child is given an individual lesson plan within the group, as well as a group lesson plan. Over time, the child is observed and evaluated by the teacher. The teacher then creates a subsequent lesson plan that meets the child where he is and follows the child's interests and abilities throughout the school year. Each child is in one classroom environment for three years, which provides the child and teacher the opportunity to develop a relationship in a community-like setting. This gives the child a very secure place to learn as well as an unlimited opportunity to progress academically. As a young child enters the three-year classroom, she observes how the older children act and behave, which gives her intrinsic motivation to challenge herself to get to that level. Additionally, as the older child progresses she is able to mentor the younger children. One of the Montessori beliefs is that if an older child can teach a concept, that older child has truly learned the concept. These are some of the many ways that we individualize education, open up the possibilities for advancement, and inspire children on a daily basis.

Center Montessori School is committed to the Montessori Method of education and every classroom is specially equipped with didactic Montessori materials. These manipulative materials make it possible for children to learn by doing rather than by being told. The materials are age appropriate and are intended to be presented to children in order to enhance their learning and awareness, first of simple concepts, and later of complicated academic ideas. In addition to these very beautiful materials, each classroom is under the direction of a certified Montessori teacher who knows the function of these materials, understands how children learn, is adept at observing and interpreting children and their work, and is prepared to meet the educational needs of each child on an individual basis. In addition to the Montessori Method, the school is known for its success in teaching children to read and write through the phonetic approach called "Words in Color". Heavily influenced by Dr. Caleb Gattegno's work in reading and mathematics education, the school strives to subordinate teaching to learning through an individualized approach to reading and mathematics. Specially-prepared, colored reading charts enhance the children's observations about how letters work to form words as well as which letters are needed to write certain spelling words. Consequently, children become fluent readers and competent spellers as well as prolific writers. For mathematics, in addition to the familiar Montessori math materials, our school utilizes colored math rods, which give the children the chance to see the algebraic relationships between numbers. Children become gymnastic with numbers. Completing the Montessori curriculum are studies in music, drama, band, jazz band, chorus, Spanish immersion, foreign languages, art, art history, computer education, and physical education.

# LAKE ERIE COLLEGE OF OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE

HOW HAS LECOM BECOME A LEADER IN MEDICAL EDUCATION? The Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine (LECOM), the nation's largest medical school, is educating the next generation of osteopathic physicians, pharmacists and dentists. Nearly 1,500 students attend the College's campus in Bradenton, Fla. LECOM has established itself as a national leader in medical education through a commitment to innovative, student-centered programs. For example, the College of Medicine's Problem-Based Learning (PBL) pathway promotes critical thinking and clinical reasoning skills through a team approach. The School of Dental Medicine also offers a PBL, patient-centered learning approach focused on extensive classroom learning and clinical training. Second-year students are now treating patients in group practice offices on the Bradenton campus. The School of Pharmacy offers a four-year Doctor of Pharmacy degree as well as an online option for students who require greater flexibility. In addition, LECOM recently introduced an online Master's program in Health Services Administration (MHSA) for students who want to develop the expertise required to plan, direct and coordinate medical and health services. The MHSA will complement LECOM's current Master's programs in Medical Education and Biomedical Sciences. A focus on affordability as well as quality and innovation allows students to graduate with considerably less debt than their peers. Among private medical schools, LECOM offers the second-lowest tuition nationally. LECOM also has established itself as a leader in medical education through its commitment to service and to providing care where it is needed most. The College is investing nearly \$6.5 million in a community-based dental office in the Florida Panhandle city of DeFuniak Springs. This dental practice will allow fourth-year students to gain valuable, hands-on experience while also providing affordable dental care for residents. At a time when health care is fundamentally changing, the Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine continues to build healthier communities, one graduate and one patient at a time.

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The Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine is preparing the next generation of health care professionals. Established in 1992 in Erie, Pa., LECOM has grown to become the largest medical school in the country. LECOM opened a branch campus in Bradenton, Fla. in 2004, which has grown to include the College of Osteopathic Medicine, School of Pharmacy and School of Dental Medicine. Medical and pharmacy students receive clinical education while working alongside physicians and pharmacists in Florida's Gulf Coast communities. The School of Dental Medicine recently opened its dental group practice in Bradenton, where students - with the supervision of faculty members-offer primary care dentistry services to the public. LECOM medical school graduates have the opportunity to continue their post-graduate training locally at Manatee Memorial Hospital and Manatee Glens residency programs. A commitment to service is one of the hallmarks of LECOM's mission. Students at LECOM's Bradenton, Erie and Greensburg, Pa., campuses volunteered over 30,000 hours of service last academic year. Students support many non-profit organizations in their communities including: the YMCA, American Red Cross, Florida Sheriff's Youth Ranch, American Cancer Society, Autism Speaks, Bridging the Gaps, Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation and Turning Points. The College has been selected to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll for eight consecutive years. This is the highest federal recognition a college or university can receive for its commitment to volunteering, service-learning and civic engagement.

### HOW DOES YOUR EDUCATION MODEL PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE

FUTURE? One of the things that I love most about NewGate is that it's both an independent and international school; we are able to offer things that aren't available at public schools. Also, independent schools are distinctly different from one another; they are not typically bound by the state exams; they have freedom to prepare children for university and for life from the school's own perspective instead of from the dictate of state legislature; and, they survive by their ability to attract families who are looking for something different. NewGate is truly an international school in several ways: Firstly, it is very appealing to families who have moved here from around the world and are looking for an education that can transfer with them if they choose to move to another country. International schools, by definition, teach an international curriculum; Montessori curriculum is focused on creating internationally educated global citizens. NewGate was recently recognized as an International Baccalaureate World School. As such, our high school graduates will have the opportunity to sit for the IB diploma examinations, and upon passing the exams, they will be able to take their high school diploma almost anywhere in the world. This provides students with high recognition in American university admissions, because IB graduates are exceptionally well prepared for a university. NewGate's college admission and completion rate has been virtually 100% since our first graduation class in 2004, but we take pride in our message that "education should be a journey, not a race." We encourage and cultivate a spirit of interest, curiosity, imagination and a passion for doing things well and mastering skills from the earliest ages. We stress the dignity and the importance of early childhood education-that is the foundation upon which everything is built. Our style and approach to education is very child-centered and very fostering of independence and a sense of empowerment for students to find their own voice and become leaders.

The NewGate School is a coeducational, non-sectarian, college preparatory international Montessori school located in Sarasota, Florida. It is authorized as an International Baccalaureate World School, offering the IB Diploma Program. NewGate is the Lab School of The Montessori Foundation, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the advancement of Montessori education in the United States and abroad. Head of School Tim Seldin is also president of The Montessori Foundation. Under his leadership the school develops curriculum and best practices for Montessori schools around the world. The goal of The NewGate School is to nurture intelligence, curiosity and imagination while supporting and developing each students' unique talents. Classrooms are carefully prepared environments for learning and discovery, set up to facilitate student discussion and stimulate collaborative learning. There are no rows of desks facing a large blackboard, but rather warm inviting spaces filled with plants, animals, art, music and books. Much of the curriculum takes place outdoors as students also learn to be stewards of their environment. The NewGate School teaches universal values and instills a global perspective, responsible citizenship, and encourages an entrepreneurial spirit. The aim is to graduate young people who are balanced between their knowledge and character so they become life-long learners, critical thinkers and active leaders in their local community, their country the world. In 2015, The NewGate School will offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program to all of its students. This international program is recognized university work. 
### HOW DOES YOUR CURRICULUM PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE?

Academic excellence is central to the culture at Saint Stephen's, Our teachers are passionate about the subjects they teach and genuinely care about the success of each student. With the freedom that comes from being an independent school, each teacher develops and presents a curriculum that challenges and reflects the individual attributes of their students. As a result, our students are exposed to a variety of real world and enrichment opportunities that encourage them to go beyond the classroom and into that world that will soon be their work evironment. This past year we adopted an iPad initiative, which required every student, sixth through twelfth grade, to bring an iPad to school. This enhanced the curriculum by providing students with access to a world of information at their fingertips. Preparing students for the future using 21st century tools gets them engaged in the most innovative advancements in education, which encourages critical thinking and improves their analytical skills. Our economics instructor brings local entrepreneurs and experienced financial advisors into the classroom to provide students with real life information and scenarios as part of the curriculum. Saint Stephen's students have the benefit of doing environmental science field work on the Manatee River and beyond with regular access to Freedom Boat Club's vessels and guides enhancing their classroom and lab experiences. Our language curriculum provides pre-kindergarten students with the opportunity to learn both the Mandarin and Spanish language. From kindergarten through twelfth grade, students study language five days a week; they're not just exposed to the foreign language, but they are writing, reading and speaking the language to the point of fluency. This prepares students to actively engage in the globally driven society of their future. Finally, we have integrated across the disciplines our STEaM (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics) program, which challenges our students to employ innovative problem solving and interconnected, critical thinking across those five areas. With the inclusion of the arts, we feel that a sense of creativity enhances the other areas-cross-curricular coordination is of utmost importance for those disciplines to work together. The many special features of our curriculum provide our students with a well-rounded, practical education that thoroughly prepares them for the future.

The fall of 2013 saw the introduction of the iPad initiative, which gives all students direct instruction using this technology in a meaningful and integrated manner. Marine Science is an initiative allowing students to study the ocean environment from a variety of different perspectives and across disciplines from our backyard, campus dock and out on kayaks and boats. This initiative promotes active learning through exploration of the McLewis Bayou, Manatee River, and beyond. Finally, our Emotional Intelligence initiative influences teaching and learning with the notion that students need to grow both socially and emotionally, in addition to growing academically and athletically. Volunteerism is an important part of the curriculum at Saint Stephen's. Along with the Falcon Friend program, middle school classes spend one service day a month at various sites in Manatee County. They read to young children at public elementary schools, help with planting and weeding at Palma Sola Botanical Garden and Geraldson Community Farm, spend time with residents at elderly day care centers and fill packets for Hope Seeds that get sent to third-world countries. High school students are required to complete 100 hours of service.


